Safety - Reportable Rail Events


- 143 reportable events and hazards

Safety - Train Collisions


A total of 39 train Collisions

- 1. Involved objects, 1 resulted in \$25K 2 incidents
- 2. Involved another TriMet vehicle (4 buses & 1 NRV) 5 incidents
- 3. Involved a motor vehicle within a rail grade crossing (19 passenger vehicles & 1 commercial motor vehicle) 20
- 4. Involved a person/bicyclist 12 (3) were serious injury






5-year History of Reportable Collisions






Train Collision Locations






5-year History of Reportable PCBQ Collisions by Street





Safety – Rail Incident Review Board

- Examines train accidents & incidents to make determinations if the accident was preventable
- Majority of collisions, the rail operator could not have avoided the collision.

2019 Fare Evasion Survey


10,782 Riders Surveyed

Reason Cited for No or Invalid Fare



- 62% of those surveyed without valid fare indicated they either did not tap, forgot to tap, or took a chance.
- 2% indicated they could not afford fare.


