



STF Background and History

- Established in 1985 in support of transportation services for seniors and people with disabilities.
- Funds are distributed to 42 designated agencies based on population: Cities, Counties, Transportation districts, Public or private agencies and Indian Tribes.
- Designed to be flexible, coordinated, reliable, and continuing source of revenue originally funded with cigarette tax, ID card revenue, other funds as directed.



STF Purpose and Intent

 Provides transportation services to access health, education, work and social/recreation opportunities to support independent living

• Emphasizes services for seniors and

people with disabilities of any age

 All trip types: to healthcare, education, work and social/ recreation opportunities to support independent living

STIF

Public transportation

 - Intercommunity connections
 - Coordination between providers
 - Serving high school students



STF Funded Projects


Examples of eligible projects:

- Match for federal grants for projects that provide service for seniors and people with disabilities
- Dial-a-ride transportation services (curb-to-curb or door-to-door service)
- Taxi and bus ticket subsidy programs
- Travel training
- Purchases of equipment, such as vans, buses and wheelchair lifts






Current Funding Sources

- Share recommendations with the HB2017 Transit Advisory Committee




Important STF Dates
