## Questions answered by Carl Green, Jr after meeting:

1) Does TriMet cover the cost of the regular cab or does that expense fall on the customer? This question came about while reading #5C sub point 3, which prompts the Operator to ask the customer "Can you use a regular cab or do you require a vehicle with lift equipment?"

Response: Covered by TRIMET - Broadway Bus for ADA

2) Will a customer be stranded if the bus is at capacity and that bus is on it's last run for the night and no other bus coming behind them?

Response: Operators are instructed to not pass up for the last run of the night. At this time, we have not had heard any occurrences being called in for this. With the abundance of extra service, it should not happen.

3) How will the operator notice pass up and rider limit guidance impact workers trying to get to work on time?

Response: All modes are running with reduced service. This policy is for the safety and well-being for our operators and riders. Please plan your trip before you go and leave extra travel time.

4) Do you have the operator notice pass up guidance translated?

Response: Yes, in all 13 safe harbor languages within the TriMet service district. See attached
