**Update on security on our system, including efforts to increase presence and partnerships by Andrew Wilson**

Review of incidents:

- Gateway Transit Center- Dec 29, 2022, the individual was arrested less than a minute after the incident
- Cleveland Ave Station- Jan 3, 2023; this happened on a closed platform, non-service hours. The Multnomah County Sheriff's Office & Gresham Police responded to the event, and the suspect was arrested.

TriMet has different options for handling security situations.

- We are increasing the security presence on the system and the number of Customer Safety Supervisors and Officers. We have a pilot program with the Safety Response Team, which connect people with resources.
- TriMet is working closely with the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office, and they lead the task force model.

The issues we have in the community are those we have on the system- Mental health, Houselessness, and Drugs and Addictions.

- The only group armed on the system is the Transit police.
- The customer Safety Supervisor positions increase is **independent** of the Fare Increase Proposal.
- Is there any data on the relationship between harassment/ assaults and fare enforcement? We don't have that level of detail.
- TriMet takes very seriously and conducts depth investigations on fatal transit incidents.
- We are seeing violations related to all codes going down. Security presence is a mitigation factor.
- TriMet has partnered with the University of Washington Department of Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences to study the impacts and potential risks of second-hand fentanyl smoke. [Here is the article.](#)

### **Review fare increase proposal timeline, Title VI, and potential mitigations by John Gardner**

**John walked through the timeline of the fare increase proposal and outlined some of the potential mitigations that will be included in the Title VI's study such as**

- Updating Existing Subsidy Programs
- Initiating New Reduced Programs
- Increasing Program Participation

Staff also noted The Board could also delay the fare change or modify the fare proposal. The final decision will be made at May's meeting.
